Sure GPS devices are getting cheaper, but the good ones are still between \$400 - \$900. That's some serious dough, so if you're not sure which GPS is right for you, or just need a GPS for a few days, [GPS4Rent](#) might be just the thing for you. Given that a good GPS device still costs anywhere from \$300 to \$1000, it's surprising there aren't more rental services. Currently they're offering a range of Magellan GPS units (including some with real-time traffic data) that cost between \$9 and \$13/day to rent (3 day minimum). You're also on the hook for the UPS shipping charges, but given the size and weight, that should be pretty affordable.

[Auto Nav 2000 Plus, Inc.](#) has been in business since 1996, and I've personally purchased 5 GPS units from them over the past 10 years - so you don't have to worry about it being some shady online store. AutoNav 2000 also maintains several brick-and-mortar retail shops in Northern California, and a regular [web store](#) if you're looking to purchase rather than rent. If you've been thinking about getting a GPS but are on the fence, or just need one for a special trip, the rental service might be just what the dr. ordered.
